The school is located in the Town of Thika in Kiambu County, central Kenya about an hour's drive from the Capital, Nairobi.

Variety Village Training Centre was officially opened in March 1979. The Variety Club of Great Britain funded much of the cost.

then sit a government trade certificate.Opthalmology

The Project:

The Kenya Trust first became involved with helping Variety Village back in 2011 when we provided £1,000 for the supply of knitting machines.

Since then the trust have continued to support the training centre with various projects including: general refurbishment and maintenance of buildings, supply of new chairs and redecoration of the girls dormitory, improvements to and maintenance of the water supply system and the supply of fire extinguishers to bring the centre into compliance with fire regulations.

The most significant project was in July of 2019 when the trust funded the refurbishment of dormitories, and the dining hall and the supply of dining tables and benches for the pupils. This amounted to £12,050.
