# Trustee Introduction: Patricia Owen

Patricia was born in London. When three years old the family moved to Hong Kong where they lived for nearly four years. On returning to UK they settled in Bristol and attended Bristol Citadel corps (church). When 12 years old, Patricia became the Singing Company (junior choir) accompanist. These early days of service have taken Patricia through SA music schools as student and instructor, music college, a career in music teaching and piano accompaniment with appearances at The Royal Albert Hall, Symphony Hall and Roy Thompson Hall to mention a few.

In 1973 her marriage took her to Birmingham Citadel and was soon the accompanist for the songster brigade (senior choir).

She was privileged to serve in this role for nearly 25 years. Patricia now accompanies the vibrant Singing Company (full circle) and is the corps pianist, this role leading her to record the CD 'Keys for Kenya'.

Patricia was a founder member of SA Music for Kenya Fund (latterly The Kenya Trust) becoming secretary in 2016 and representative for Kenya East Territory.

Her interest in Kenya started in 1992 when she adopted two orphaned elephants for her daughter. From her first visit in 1999 has grown a love for Kenya and its people. Patricia has since participated in music schools and fact-finding visits, the latest being in October 2019.

Patricia lives in Worcester, is married and has three children, four grandchildren and two step grandchildren.



# Project 2021: Renovations at Makhwabuye Primary School

In our Spring/Summer Newsletter of 2020, we launched what we hoped would be our 2020 Project – Renovations at the Makhwabuye Primary School in western Kenya, however COVID had other ideas and we were stopped in our tracks.

We are pleased to report that we did not allow this major set-back to halt our desire and passion to help the children at Makhwabuye so we set about planning and working toward a revised plan of action. We had already set out the project in 5 phases and this soon became 6. We then set about working with The Salvation Army in western Kenya and the School Board of Management to set some priorities. The school's priority was the building of a new classroom and then the construction of a 3-door pit latrine.



In October 2020, The Kenya Trust was able to send £10,000 to build a new classroom which was the start of this major refurbishment

project. In December we received pictures of the classroom being built. (pic above)

In March 2021 we received an update showing the classroom nearly complete. This is a major milestone for the school.



Last year the trust also approached the St. James' Place Charitable Foundation with an application to



provide funding for the 3 door pit latrine and in November 2020 we received confirmation that the application for funding had been

approved and so construction of the pit latrines has now started.


costs only £11.75.

#### **Instrument Donations**

In the summer of last year the trust was contacted by Somerset Music Services; they wanted to donate to The Kenya Trust a large selection of brass instruments, mainly trombones, cornets, and trumpets.

The instruments had been used extensively for classroom brass lessons across Somerset schools over the past few years and were in various conditions of repair and playability.

During the summer of 2020 and post lockdown (the first one) we were able to travel and collect the consignment of instruments. We then began to sort, grade and where necessary, repair the instruments in preparation for onward travel to Kenya.

Those instruments considered beyond reasonable repair were sold and the money raised used to offset the cost of transporting the remainder to Kenya.

The cost of shipment to Kenya has risen significantly during this pandemic and the post Covid cost for transport are expected to remain for some time, at least until air travel returns to some form of normality. The cost of shipping averages out at about £45 per instrument.
