Trustee Profile – Richard Whitmore



Richard is a fourth generation Salvationist and worships at the small Corps in Potton, Bedfordshire. He enjoys playing euphonium and baritone and has been a Bandmaster in the Salvation Army for over thirty years. In his professional life Richard is a Chartered Certified Accountant and set up his own Accountancy and Taxation Services Practice over thirty years ago.

Richard joined The Kenya Trust in February 2017 after attending several Into Africa concerts and an introduction to the work of the Trust by a founder Member and Trustee, Hilton Baker. He enjoys the involvement in the business of the trust and in the activities involved in raising funds for the trust's work. In April 2017 Richard took over responsibility as internal auditor and financial reporting of the Trust.

In October 2018 Richard walked part of The Great Wall of China raising over £4,250 to support various projects of the Trust.

Richard has always had a love of brass bands both in and outside of The Salvation Army and as part of his work for the trust is keen to promote and support Salvation Army banding in Kenya. There is a great need for brass instruments so Richard is keen to collect any donated instruments and raise funds to ship these instruments to Kenya where they can once again be played to the Glory of God. In many corps in Kenya the shortage of instruments for players to use is abnormally high. At one corps alone a band of over twenty players has only four instruments to use and they must take it in turns to play.

In October 2019, on a visit to Kenya with fellow trustees, Richard was moved by the enthusiasm of the Kenyan Salvationists but also by the poor and often shocking conditions in which many are living. There is so much need and yet they are so vibrant in their faith, worship and love of God.

Instrument Shipments

Over the years more than 3,000 instruments, brass, guitars, keyboards as well as accessories and music have been sent to Kenya. During 2021 the trustees travelled the country from Yorkshire to Somerset collecting instruments which have been donated by individuals, brass bands, schools and other music trusts. The Kenya Trust is very grateful for all the interest and generosity shown by so many.

In February of this year a shipment of 104 instruments and a large collection of brass band music (mainly hymn tune books for the many Salvation Army bands now operating in Kenya) was sent to Nairobi.

Donations of non-brass instruments such as clarinets, violins and saxophones have also been collected, some have been sent to Kenya while others have been sold here in the UK to raise the much needed funds to pay for the shipping costs for consignments to Kenya. Shipping costs have escalated enormously since the pandemic and now average out at approximately £45 per instrument. If you would like to donate either an instrument (brass or otherwise), mouthpiece, lyre, music stands, instrument tutors/teaching materials/books are always welcome. Financial donations toward payment of our next consignment which will be going to Kenya sometime in the first quarter of 2023 then please get in touch – contact details at the end of the newsletter.

Over £1300 has been raised to fund the ongoing project at Muthanthara school.


ADDITIONAL EVENTS:

Christmas Present Ideas:





Our project for 2022 is well underway. The trust has sent just over £24,000 to Kenya to get the project started. The funds will enable to building of the two blocks of pit latrines at the primary school and one classroom plus desks and chairs at the secondary school. To complete the project, we are currently raising £12,315 for the second classroom at the secondary school.
